



Unless human species 6 to <u>stop</u> hunting each other in senseless and pointless acts of terrorism, our civilization 7 inevitably <u>to end</u> in smoke, "not with a bang but a whimper." Thus, the future 8 <u>to prepare</u> by today. Life, hopes, happiness of the future generations depend on today's readiness to stop useless violence.
